COVER PHOTO: BC-616 converted for use with the 'Rerailment Crew' and painted in the same orange livery as their railcar CMC-201.


Has since been repainted in Naga and was allocated to Lucena at the time of compiling this.



The last surviving four wheeled boxcar, in government ownership, still exists in Tutuban yard as of September 2019. This item would be among the most historically important items of rollingstock in the 'Philippine National Railways' fleet and the 'Philippine Railway Historical Society' has long pushed for it's preservation.

It is believed this fleet once numbered from BC-500 to somewhere near BC-700. The underframes are thought to be essentially the same as an FL, the box was built on top in Caloocan Workshops following delivery from Japan.










Carriage has since been scrapped.

BC NOTES:

- * FCD stands for Freightcar Division.
- * The green line on the boxcars was part of the final rehabilitation (1989 till 1992). Division abolished in 2008. Our following lists show which of these had been completed by August 1988.
- * Dark blue appears to have been used on boxcars trapped at Naga following Typhoon Reming (November 2006).

BC CLASS (500-684) - AUGUST 1988

A look at the official PNR listing of the type back in August 1988.

Numerous numbers are missing. These were likely scrapped (earlier numbers) or yet to be built (later numbers). However, none of neither has yet been confirmed.
